The Future Looks Bright for the Keystone PTO!



We hope you have heard the news; at the recent PTO general meeting members voted to adopt new bylaws. These bylaws dramatically restructure the Keystone PTO and its operations. We are thrilled, because we believe this will create a more vibrant organization and a more closely-knit parent/teacher community. There are now more ways than ever to become involved in the Keystone PTO!

The new PTO will be led by twelve elected officers and the Head of School. Each officer will have a specific function and will serve a term of one year. (This replaces the current structure of Parent Council reps with two-year terms.) Working with these officers will be committee chairs and volunteers who don't necessarily want to serve in an elected position, but who are willing to lead or help with a specific PTO project. As you can see, the organization will rely on a much broader base of parent support; we hope you will consider joining the team!

The new bylaws also outline new election procedures, and accordingly, this Nominating Committee consisting of one parent from each division and a non-voting chair has been formed. We are charged with generating a slate of officers that will be distributed by April 14 and voted on during the next general PTO meeting on April 28. To begin this process, we sincerely want your input about who you think those officers should be. We are gladly accepting PTO officer nominations from now until April 8. If YOU are interested, please don't hesitate to nominate yourself.

To the right is a list of the new PTO offices and election procedures as they are described in the bylaws. (The complete bylaws can be found at: http://www.keystoneschool.org/Parents/PTO/PTO_Bylaws.pdf.) If you have questions, a Parent Council or Nominating Committee member will be happy to answer them. As you consider yourself or others for nomination, please try to be specific about which functions best match a candidate's talents and interests. Keep in mind that many positions do not require election. Any suggestions you'd like to make of parents who might be willing to serve will be shared with the newly elected officers and will help them immensely as they plan the coming year. You may give your nominations and suggestions directly to a member of the Nominating Committee, email them to Amy Zesch at azesch@satx.rr.com, or leave them (anonymously, if you like) in the PTO lock box located near the reception desk at school.

Now every Keystone parent, teacher and administrator is a voting member of the PTO, and this is an exciting time of transition for the organization. As the new PTO evolves, so will its projects and its ability to effectively support Keystone School. We invite you to be part of this evolution!

Parent Council offices, in a nutshell

President: Presides at all meetings of the Parent Council and of the PTO, represents the organization to the Administration and Board of Trustees, appoints standing and special committee chairs (with help from other Parent Council members), maintains frequent and regular contact with the Head of School, is the face of the PTO!

<u>President-Elect</u>: Assists the President as needed, presides at meetings when the President can't, becomes familiar with the duties and functions of the President so he/she can assume that office at the end of their term as President-Elect.

<u>Vice-President—Communication:</u> Organizes and oversees production of this newsletter and of the PTO webpage, and provides notice of all PTO meetings.

<u>Vice-President—Community</u>: Organizes and oversees PTO events to welcome new students and their families, compiles a list of parent volunteers and distributes it to Parent Council members and committee chairs, organizes and oversees teacher appreciation activities, and helps administrators and teachers as needed to coordinate parent support for events.

<u>Vice-President—Fund Raising:</u> Organizes and oversees all programs intended to solicit or generate funds for *the PTO* and its initiatives (PTO back-to-school campaign, textbook recycling program, "Box Tops for Education," etc.)

<u>Vice-President—Student Enrichment</u>: Organizes and oversees PTO sponsored guest-speaker events for members and/or students, and oversees the disbursement of PTO funds to benefit of all divisions of the school ("Wish List").

<u>Secretary</u>: Typical secretarial stuff like minutes of all meetings and PTO correspondence as needed!

Treasurer: Typical treasurer stuff like preparing the budget (along with the rest of the Parent Council), making deposits, signing checks, issuing acknowledgements for tax donors, and preparing regular financial reports!

Parliamentarian: Gives advice about proper parliamentary procedure; reviews the PTO Bylaws annually and recommends revisions, and serves as non-voting chair of the Nominating Committee for PTO elections.

Lower, Middle, and Upper School Representatives: Act as liaisons for PTO support to their respective Division Heads, representing the interests of their divisions to the Parent Council and keeping the PTO informed about opportunities to lend a hand. They may be asked to help their Division Heads and the VP—Community coordinate parent volunteers.

The PTO Wish List Program gives faculty, staff, and administration the opportunity to apply for those things that may not be covered by the normal budgeting process of the school. This year, the PTO received a number of applications from across the schools and was pleased to present the following:
