## A Message From our Headmaster

Dear Keystone Community,

It's green day today in Kindergarten. Yesterday was blue day, and I found it easy to dress the part: blue shirt, blue tie, blue blazer ("It's navy," one of the five-year-olds pointed out to me, "but that's OK."). Today's color is a little trickier given my wardrobe. I have a green jacket and a green tie, but they won't work together. The jacket is corduroy - thick corduroy. It was one of two I often wore in Idaho, in January. I decide that the tie simply won't satisfy the kindergartners, so, I don the corduroy jacket and head for school. I have lunch in town, with jacket required. I run back in the house and grab a lightweight blazer for that event. To be honest, I'm more concerned about dressing the part for the kindergarten than for the luncheon.

The preoccupation with clothing colors is part of my very enjoyable learning process here at Keystone. In an effort to become better acquainted with the people and programs, I have endeavored to get in to different classes throughout these first two weeks of school. I seem to bump into the kindergarten students everywhere, and they told me about their color days this week and next. They are reading "Brown Bear," and each day they follow the color scheme of the book. I am trying to follow along. In addition to my fear of overheating today, I worry a little bit about what I'll be able to find to wear for the upcoming purple day, but we'll cross that bridge next week.

These first two weeks of school have been upbeat and busy. The excitement and energy of a new school year permeate the campus, from classrooms and hallways to the cafeteria and the blacktop. The joy of learning was best captured by one of my new second grade acquaintances, who, when asked how his first week went, replied with a jack-o-lantern grin, "I loved it." The 8<sup>th</sup> graders returned from Yellowstone safely, albeit without any good bear stories. Our upper school students are studying diligently, and despite the challenge, several seemed pleased to have three tests during the first two days of the second week. For my part, I have begun to learn the names of the 431 students on campus. I hope to have them all down by the end of the first semester. Due to my daily visits to check out their color displays, so far I have made the most progress with the kindergartners.

On behalf of the entire staff at Keystone, it is my pleasure to welcome you to the 2010-2011 school year. We look forward to an educational and enriching experience for all.

The 2009-2010 school year provided a generous income for the PTO, bringing in \$7,230, or 36 percent more than anticipated. This is thanks to generous parents who joined the PTO, paid dues, and purchased directories, as well as the work of Keystone families, PTO board members, and volunteers in donating, diligently packing up, and reselling donated textbooks at the end of the school year. Thank you all! Our expenses were below expectation too, at just over \$6,000, or only 83 percent of budgeted outlays. We begin this school year with more than \$8,300 -- ready to support the Keystone community in 2010 - 2011.
